The concert

The compositions by Chopin belong to the most beloved music of The Romantic Era. Demanding great virtuosity and subtlety from the pianist they give an insight to the richness of the human emotions with refinement unique to Chopin.

Mihkel Poll

Born in 1986 in Estonia, Mihkel Poll studied at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre with prof. Ivari Ilja and at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama with prof. Ronan O' Hora. He is currently working on his doctorate degree at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre.

Mihkel Poll has won several prizes in important international competitions including 1st prize at the Rina Sala Gallo International Piano Competition in Italy, 1st prize at the Tallinn International Piano Competition in Estonia and 1st prize at the Ferrol International Piano Competition in Spain.

Mihkel Poll has played in several countries including Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Russia, Sweden, France, Spain, Portugal, Belgium, Norway, Greece, Great Britain and the USA. He has performed with the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra, Estonian National Symphony Orchestra, Nordic Symphony Orchestra, Magdeburg Philharmonics, Sinfonia of Birmingham, Birmingham Schools' Symphony Orchestra, Norrbotten Chamber Orchestra, Norwich Philharmonics, Lincoln Symphony Orchestra, Vanemuise Symphony Orchestra and the Pärnu City Orchestra under the conductors such as Neeme Järvi, Arvo Volmer, Olari Elts, Anu Tali, Michael Seal, Eri Klas, Richard Llaing, Matt Andrews and others.

Mihkel Poll has been nominated the Estonian Cultural Endowment Award (2004) and Young Cultural Figure Award of the President of Estonia (2013).
